What We Do

Located in Colorado, LGF provides children and their families diagnosed with Autism and Autism Spectrum Disorders to education, resources, research, and scholarships for integrative & medical therapies.

OUR SERVICES

All services are provided free of charge to families with children affected by Autism and Autism Spectrum Disorders.

Our services include: Advocacy, Autism Awareness and Education, Child Development and Parent Engagement Education, Child Language Intervention, Public School ASD Classroom Yoga Classes, Respite Care, Research, Resources, Scholarships, and Support Groups.



Autism Advocacy, Awareness and Education

LGF's advocacy has led to Colorado Proclamations for Autism Awareness Month. Colorado Autism Awareness Month Proclamation was accepted as official State of Colorado Proclamation by Governor Hickenlooper. Colorado Governor John Hickenlooper authorized flags to be flown in honor of LGF and those affected by autism and neurological disorders. LGF also provides access to a free 30 minute educational course covering, an introduction to the Autism Spectrum, treatment Options, treatment Assistance, and transition to Adulthood.

Child Development & Parent Engagement Education

Through our partnership with Bright by Three (an organization founded in1995 by then-Colorado Governor Roy Romer and former Procter & Gamble Chairman Brad Butler), we connect families with free parent engagement programs and child development programs and free home visits. These programs address ageappropriate physical activity, talking and reading, emphasizes speaking to children and exposing them to language to stimulate early literacy, addresses developmental milestones, language and effective and positive discipline methods.

Child Language Intervention

We connect families with an intensive language intervention that utilizes the LENA digital language processor device. Thanks to our partnership with Bright by Three and Colorado talks back, parents receive extensive data on participants' outcomes. The LENA program enables a family to track their child's language development process and can also be used as a bio-marker for ASD.

Relaxation Station: Children's Yoga Public School Project

Our evidenced based integrated approach to yoga as a therapeutic modality for autism spectrum disorders. Because of the researched benefits of this program, the Relaxation Station has now been implemented in other Colorado Public Schools. The Relaxation Station is designed to help children in the Autism Spectrum acquire self-calming and sensory regulation skills to be successful in transition into general education classes.

OUR SERVICES, continued



Research

Through the partnerships of ImmunoE Health Centers and Proactive Wellness of the Rockies to create an unprecedented combination of specialized pediatric care and cutting edge biomedical interventions. LGF's and ImmunoE's shared vision inspired them to unify these specialties and provide integrative therapeutic programs, while allowing for unique research opportunities. In partnership with Lily Grace Foundation, this Center will facilitate the research of new developments and technologies in the treatment of Autism Spectrum Disorders. Families can apply on our website to see if they qualify for an ASD study.

Respite Events

Respite plays an important factor in the well-being of caretakers. Thanks to our partnership with Kroenke Sports Charities, LGF is able to provide respite tickets year round to our children and family clients to sporting events to the Colorado Avalanche, Denver Nuggets, Colorado Mammoth, and Colorado Rapids and various entertainment events.

Autism Resource Library

Whether families are searching for medical or alternative treatments, looking to connect with support groups, or interested in research, browse Autism Speaks' Resource Library. The Family Services Resource Guide as a service to families as a reference tool. Users are urged to use independent judgment and request references when considering any resource associated with diagnosis or treatment of autism, or the provision of services related to autism.

Scholarships for ASD Medical and Integrative Therapies

The Lily Grace Foundation provides funding to the Residents of Colorado for the purchase of ASD medical and integrative therapies. If the application is approved by the Lily Grace Foundation, monies are paid directly to the vendor/provider. Checks are not payable to the applicant. Interested families or individuals may fill out a scholarship application describing the service needed and the funding amount request. Application are reviewed by Board of Directors members on a quarterly basis for selection. LGF also provides resources so families can search an access additional family autism care grants.

Support Groups

If you or someone you love is affected by ASD, you are not alone. Our next support group opens Fall 2017. You may search additional ASD support groups in your area on our website.

Who We Serve

LGF serves families with children affected by Autism and Autism Spectrum Disorders. All of our services are provided free of charge.

What is Autism? Autism and autism spectrum disorder (ASD) are both general terms for a group of complex disorders of brain development. These disorders are characterized, in varying degrees, by difficulties in social interaction, verbal and nonverbal communication and repetitive behaviors. Autism has its roots in early brain development. However, the most obvious signs of autism and symptoms of autism tend to emerge between 12 and 18 months of age. Increasing autism awareness is a key aspect of LGF, one in which our families and volunteers play an invaluable role.



Autism statistics from the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) identify around 1 in 68 American children as on the autism spectrum. This is a ten-fold increase in prevalence over the last 40 years.

Studies also show that autism is **four to five times more common among boys than girls**. An estimated 1 out of 42 boys and 1 in 189 girls are diagnosed with autism in the United States.

ASD is estimated to affect more than 2 million individuals in the United States.

Worldwide, ASD is estimated to affect tens of millions individuals.

Moreover, government autism statistics suggest that prevalence rates have increased 10-17 percent annually in recent years.
